2. Objective

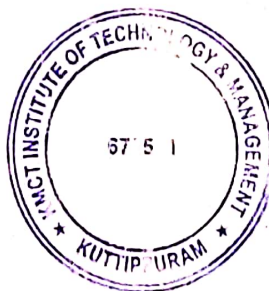
The primary goal of the program was to sensitize new students to the legal and social implications of campus misconduct. Key areas of focus included:

4. Resource Person

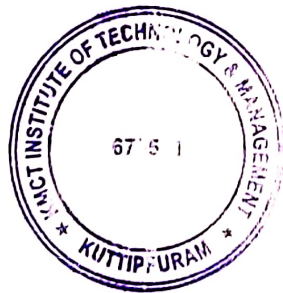

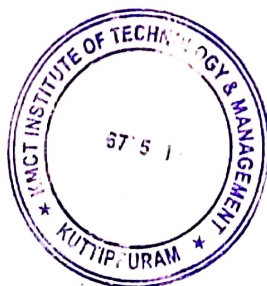

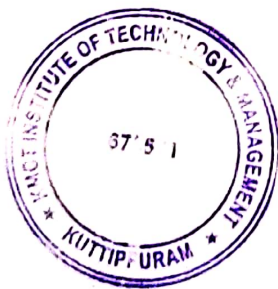

Report on Anti-Ragging Awareness Session

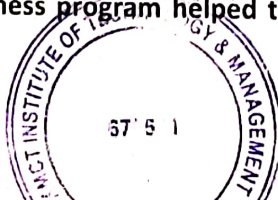
An Anti-Ragging Awareness Session was conducted on 5th August 2024 as part of the First Year Orientation Program for the Diploma Batch 2024–27 at KMCT Institute of Technology and Management (KMCT ITM). The program was organized by the Anti-Ragging Cell of KMCT ITM to create awareness among newly admitted students and their parents about the serious consequences of ragging and to ensure a safe and friendly learning environment on campus.

The session was addressed by Principal P. H. Subair, who explained the importance of maintaining discipline, mutual respect, and positive interaction among students. In his talk, he clearly described what ragging is, the different forms it may take, and why it is strictly prohibited in educational institutions. He emphasized that ragging is a punishable offense and that the institution follows strict anti-ragging regulations as per government and university guidelines.

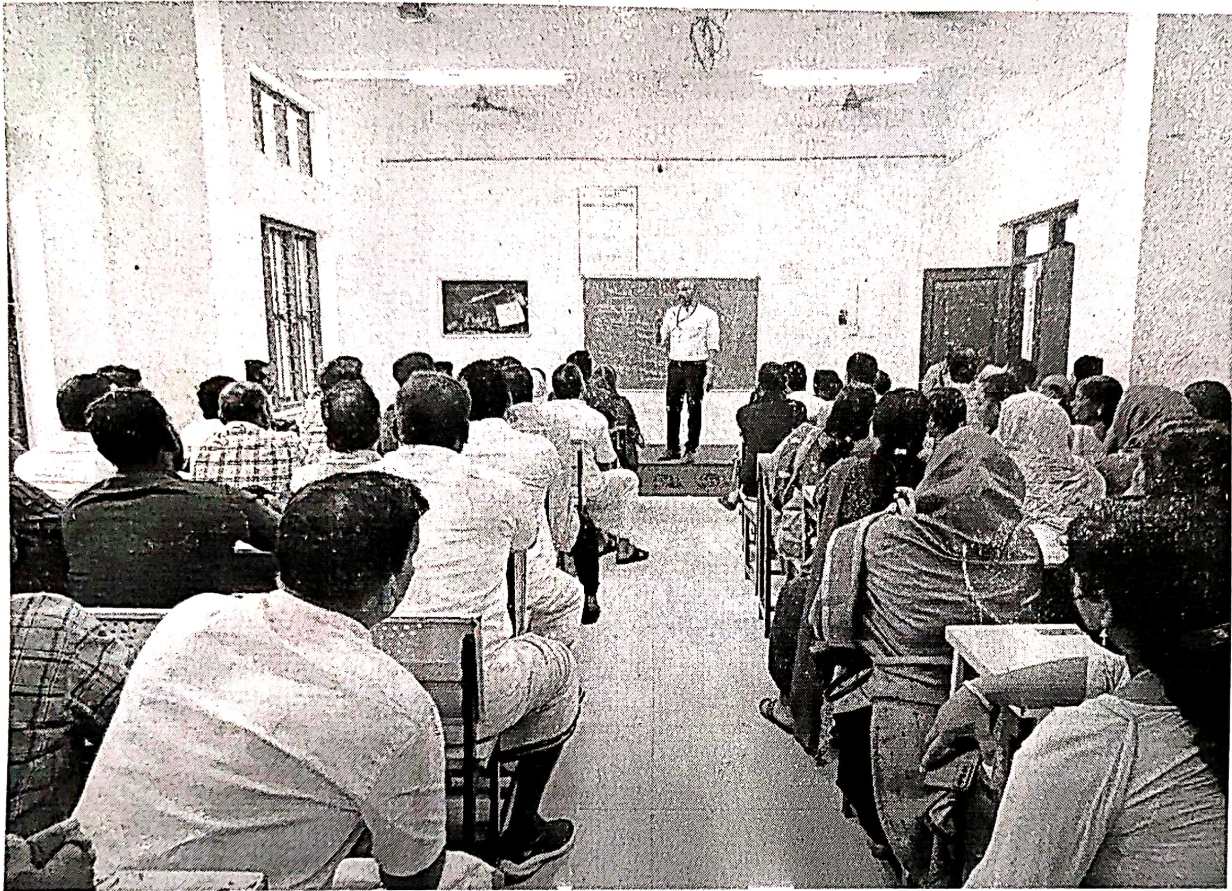
